☑ Membership growth: A membership drive added 177 new life members, taking total membership to 1,873.

☑ Representation in key national bodies : IMMA continued representation in key national safety and mining bodies and actively addressed critical industry issues such as illegal mining, land acquisition, safety, and empowerment of Mine Managers.

- Strengthened digital presence via website and social platforms
- It was pointed out that submission of accounts from several branches is still pending.

Following Constitutional amendments proposed by the Council approved by Council held on 7th March 2026 was placed before the AGM for its approval :-


1. The IMMA Council shall be empowered to create additional posts for its Branches, including Vice Chairman, Joint Secretaries, and Deputy Treasurer, subject to a unanimous decision of the Council.
2. The following additional posts may also be created at Central Committee of the IMMA , as required:
 - i. Two Secretaries
 - ii. One Deputy Treasurer
 - iii. One additional Auditor
 - iv. Two additional Editors

The above amendments were approved unanimously by the members at the AGM.

It was followed by presentation of the audited accounts of the association by Sri Y Ansari, Treasurer.
